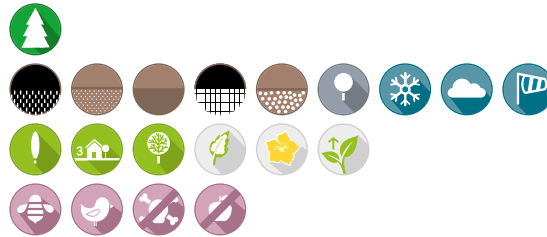




Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata Aureomarginata'



Height	4-6 m
Crown	columnar, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	flaking, roodbruin
Leaf	variegated, off white/ green, evergreen
Flowers	yellow, flowers in April
Fruits	fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clay soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, acid soil, calcareous soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	6b (-20,5 to -17,8 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
Application	parks, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, industrial areas, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens
Shape	specimen conifer
Synonyms	Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata Aurea', Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata Mediovariegata'

A small tree that is narrow columnar at first, but spreads out later. At around 3 m it remains significantly smaller than the green T. baccata 'Fastigiata'. Its compact growth means it produces a very dense crown. The branches grow straight up. The young twigs are green-yellow, the old bark is brown-red and flaking. The yellow to creamy white variegated needles are arranged in a spiral and around 3 cm long and 0.3 cm wide. The blossom is male so no fruit is produced. Suitable for parks, cemeteries and gardens. It is also found under the synonyms 'Fastigiata Aurea' and 'Fastigiata Mediovariegata'.
