



## Acer rubrum 'Schlesingeri'



<b>Height</b>	15-20 m
<b>Crown</b>	narrow vase-shaped, dark, dense crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Autumn colour</b>	orange, red, purple
<b>Flowers</b>	red, flowers in March
<b>Fruits</b>	red
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil, acid soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates partial paving
<b>Winter hardness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	bad
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant)
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, cemeteries, large gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree

Medium-sized tree with a vase-like to egg-shaped crown that is dense and closed. Height to circa 20 m. Young twigs strikingly red-brown. The leaf stalk too is red, while the leaf is bright green and circa 12 cm. The underside of the leaf is blue-green. The orange-red to deep purple colouring in autumn starts early and it is one of the nicest colourings within the *A. rubrum* assortment. The red flowers emerge before the leaves. The tree develops a sturdy main root with fibrous rootlets. In limy soil the growth is stunted. In this soil as well as in soil that is too dry, there will be no colouring in autumn. Poor tolerance to (sea) wind. Winter hardness zone: 4
