



## Acer 'Silver Vein'



<b>Height</b>	6-8 m
<b>Crown</b>	narrow vase-shaped, half-open crown, capricious growing
<b>Bark and branches</b>	striped, grey, white
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Autumn colour</b>	yellow
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in April
<b>Fruits</b>	inconspicuous
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardness zone</b>	5 (-28,8 to -23,4 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	fairly to good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Application</b>	parks, tree containers, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem tree
<b>Synonyms</b>	Acer conspicuum 'Silver Vein'

Fairly slender, vertical tree with a fan-shaped crown. Sometimes has one trunk but frequently also has multiple trunks. The bark is among the most conspicuously marked of all the snake bark maples. Conspicuous silver-grey stripes decorate the blue-grey bark. The glossy, green leaves are 3-lobed, but the outer lobes are relatively small, reduced more or less to leaf points in some leaves. The leaf turns dark yellow in autumn. 'Silver Vein' is a splendid, solitary tree. The attractive bark features well in either gardens or parks.
