



Celtis biondii



Height	4 – 6 (12) m
Crown	vase-shaped, half-open crown
Bark and branches	twigs green, initially rust brown, later green, bark grey, smooth
Leaf	ovate to narrow elongated, 5-10 cm long, green
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	inconspicuous, yellow-green, April
Fruits	drupe, 6 mm, orange
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil
Paving	tolerates paving
Winter hardiness zone	5 (-28,8 to -23,4 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, valuable for butterflies
Application	avenues and broad streets, parks, cemeteries, industrial areas, large gardens
Shape	clearstem tree
