



## Crataegus crus-galli 'Salicifolia'



<b>Height</b>	10-12 m
<b>Crown</b>	flatened spherical, half-open crown, capricious growing
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	white, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	red
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	Yes
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), provides food for birds
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, large gardens

This moderately tall tree has a broad and irregular crown growing to a height of up to 12 m. The crown is formed by branches that spread as they grow. There are few thorns on the branches. The leaves are elongated to narrow elliptical and are glossy green. The white flowers appear in umbels in May and June. The fruits follow in late summer. They are approx. 1 cm in diameter, red, and they remain on the tree for a long time. Because of its broad manner of growth this tree requires a roomy site. Suitable for parks and avenues. Very uncommon. Winter hardiness zone: 4
