



## Fagus sylvatica 'Grandidentata'



<b>Height</b>	15-20 m
<b>Crown</b>	broad ovoid, dark, dense crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Autumn colour</b>	yellow
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	brown
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	5b (-26,0 to -23,4 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Application</b>	parks, cemeteries, large gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, feathered tree

*Fagus sylvatica 'Grandidentata'* is a park tree with a spreading round-ovoid crown and a height of circa 15 - 20 m. The large, wide ovate leaf has a regular, coarsely toothed margin but is less deeply dissected than the leaf of *F. sylvatica 'Asplenifolia'*. The leaf base is strikingly cuneate. The leaf is green and has a yellow autumn colouring. Blooms in small, inconspicuous flower catkins, followed by small nuts in autumn. Prefers well-drained soil that is not too wet and rich in humus content. Moderately wind resistant. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
