Fagus sylvatica 'Purpurea Pendula'



| Height | 3 - 5 m (depending on graft height) |
|-----------------------|--|
| Crown | broad, weeping, dark, dense crown, capricious growing |
| Bark and branches | smooth, grey bark, soft |
| Leaf | oval to ovate, deep reddish brown, 4 - 10 cm long |
| Flowers | small, inconspicuous flower catkins, May |
| Fruits | nuts, in cupules covered with brushy spines, 1 - 2 cm |
| Spines/thorns | None |
| Toxicity | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock |
| Soil type | well drained, humic soil, not too wet |
| Paving | tolerates no paving |
| Winter hardiness zone | 6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C) |
| Wind resistance | moderate |
| Other resistances | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6) |
| Application | parks, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens |
| Shape | clearstem tree |
| Origin | Germany, circa 1865 |

Fagus sylvatica 'Purpurea Pendula' is slow-growing weeping beech. It does not form a central leader making propagation onto understock at a pre-determined height (e.g. 2.20 m) or nursing on stock of low grafted plants necessary. The main branches grow downwards in an arch, young twigs droop loosely. The deep red-brown leaves are oval to ovate and 4 - 10 cm. It is suitable for smaller gardens when used as a solitary.

Requires not too wet, well-drained soil, rich in humus content. Moderate wind resistance. Winter hardiness zone: 6a
