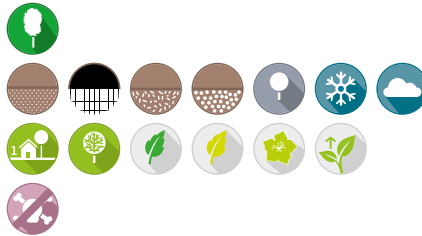




Fagus sylvatica 'Rohan Gold'



Height	14-16 m
Crown	round/spherical, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green, yellow, yellow
Flowers	yellowgreen, flowers in May
Fruits	brown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, calcareous soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	5b (-26,0 to -23,4 °C)
Wind resistance	moderate
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Application	parks, cemeteries, large gardens
Shape	clearstem tree

Fagus sylvatica 'Rohan Gold' grows in a compact way and has a round crown. Height circa 14 - 16 m. The leaf unfolds in bright yellow colours and turns to light green soon. This 'prevents' the tree from scorching. The leaf is oblong-ovate, moderately to deeply dissected with rounded lobes and 4 - 7 cm in size. The inconspicuous inflorescence is followed by 1- 2 cm large nutlets. This crossing between 'Rohanii' and 'Zlatia' was introduced by Arboretum Trompenburg (Rotterdam, NL) in 1973. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
