




## Fagus sylvatica 'Rohan Obelisk'



<b>Height</b>	12-14 m
<b>Crown</b>	columnar, dark, dense crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	grey
<b>Leaf</b>	reddish brown
<b>Flowers</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	brown
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates no paving
<b>Winter hardness zone</b>	5b (-26,0 to -23,4 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, parks, cemeteries, large gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, feathered tree

Fagus sylvatica 'Rohan Obelisk' is a straight upright going tree that was selected from seedlings of 'Dawyck', presumably pollinated by 'Rohanii'. This tree has a more compact habit than 'Rohanii' and has the columnar habit of 'Dawyck'. Height circa 12 - 14 cm. The dark brown-red leaves are narrow and irregularly dissected and have rounded lobes. Size 4 - 10 cm. Inconspicuous inflorescence followed by nuts. Suitable as a park tree and a solitary. Prefers not too wet, well-drained soil, rich in humus content. Moderate wind resistance. Winter hardness zone: 5b
