



Fraxinus excelsior 'Aurea Pendula'



Height	5-8 m
Crown	broad weeping, half-open crown
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green, yellow, feathered leaf
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	none
Fruits	fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Soil moisture	suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	fairly
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
Application	parks, squares, cemeteries, coastal areas, industrial areas, large gardens, small gardens

Fraxinus excelsior 'Aurea Pendula' is a relatively slow-growing tree with strikingly yellow twigs. The branches are strongly pendulous giving it a nice weeping look. It can attain a height of 5 - 8 m. The compound leaf is light green in summer and has a yellow autumn colour. 'Aurea Pendula' does not bear flowers and fruits and is used as a solitary and a park tree and in gardens. The tree prefers rich, moist soil. Winter hardness zone: 4
