



Fraxinus excelsior 'Jaspidea'



Height	10-12 m
Crown	broad conical, half-open crown
Bark and branches	yellowbrown
Leaf	yellow, yellowgreen, feathered leaf
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	yellowgreen, flowers in April
Fruits	brown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Soil moisture	suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt
Application	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, cemeteries, coastal areas, industrial areas, large gardens, windbreaks
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

An average-sized tree with a conical crown and a stronger growth than 'Allgold'. Height circa 10 -12 m. The twigs are yellow and have green length-stripes and very contrasting black buds. The odd-pinnate leaves unfold yellow green and turn light green later growing as large as 25 - 30 cm. In autumn the leaf turns to a beautiful golden yellow that remains long. This ash has an inconspicuous inflorescence and generates many keys in thick bunches. 'Jaspidea' can be used as a road and street plant and in public gardens and parks. The tree prefers moist, nutritive soil. Winter hardiness zone: 4
