



Fraxinus pennsylvanica

CIMMARON ('Cimmzam')



Height	15-20 m
Crown	oval, half-open crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green, feathered leaf
Autumn colour	orange, red
Flowers	yellowgreen, flowers in May
Fruits	fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil, suitable for wet soil
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, resistant to de-icing salt
Application	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, cemeteries, coastal areas, large gardens, windbreaks
Shape	clearstem tree

Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Cimmaron' (syn. F. p. 'Cimmaron') is a tall tree up to circa 20 m. When juvenile the crown is still narrow, later it becomes more oval. Characteristic for this cultivar is the late-sprouting leaf in spring, which persists in autumn up to a week and a half longer than other cultivars. The dark green leaf has a striking stone-red to orange autumn colouring. This male variety does not produce fruits. 'Cimmaron' is useful as a park, avenue and street tree, both in dry and moist soils. Winter hardiness zone: 4
