



## Magnolia RED LUCKY ('Hong Yun')



<b>Height</b>	5-8 m
<b>Crown</b>	broad ovoid, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	pinkred, whitepink, flowers in May
<b>Fruits</b>	orange, red
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, acid soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates partial paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	6 (-23,3 to -17,8 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Application</b>	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, large gardens, small gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem
<b>Synonyms</b>	Magnolia 'Red Lucky'

Grows from a large shrub into a broad, ovoid, small to medium size tree with a height of about 5 - 8 m. The flowers have the characteristic vase-shaped tulip shape of the Magnolia. They are 10 - 20 cm in size. The 6 - 8 petals are purplish red to light pinkish red with a darker base on the outside. The inside is whitish pink to white. Usually blossoms in early May. A second, less profuse blossoming often follows in August. Was named in China and imported to Europe from there. Suitable for use in parks and gardens.
