Magnolia 'Spectrum'



Height	7-9 m
Crown	round/spherical, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green
Flowers	redvoilet, pinkred, flowers in April
Fruits	orange, pink
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, acid soil
Paving	tolerates partial paving
Winter hardiness zone	6 (-23,3 to -17,8 °C)
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Application	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, feathered tree, multi-stem treem

Medium-size tree, initially with a regular, ovoid crown, later becoming much broader and eventually nearly round. Eventual height approx. 9 m. It is a seedling sister of M. 'Galaxy' and with 'Spectrum', too, the flower buds only develop in spring, so they cannot freeze in the winter. The flower buds are bright reddish purple. The open flowers are dark pinkish red on the outside but lighter in colour on the inside. They stay narrow and rather crescent-shaped for a long time, but eventually open to a broad saucer shape. Good tree for use in residential areas, thanks also to the pronounced colours and profuse blossoms.
