




Populus x canadensis 'Marilandica'



Height	20-25 m, fast growing
Crown	broad conical, half-open crown
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green
Flowers	green, flowers in April
Fruits	greenbrown
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil
Paving	tolerates paving
Winter hardness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	bad
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
Application	avenues and broad streets, windbreaks
Shape	clearstem tree

Populus x canadensis 'Marilandica' A broad spherical to rounded crown develops from an irregular growing, rough trunk. The trunk carries many branches and characteristic heavy branches grow on the windward side. The light-green triangular leaves have an almost straight foot. The tree produces flowers in the form of female catkins. 'Marilandica' is very sensitive to leaf spot disease and fairly sensitive to rust. The tree is little sensitive to canker. This cultivar is suitable for landscape and urban planting but is very sensitive to wind. Winter hardness zone: 4
