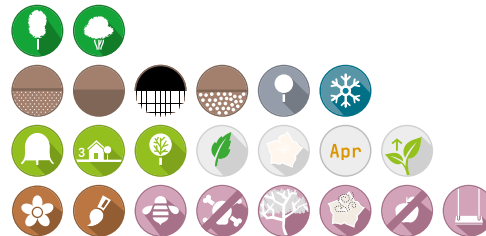




Prunus ×yedoensis 'Ivensii'



Height	3 - 4 m, depending on graft height
Crown	broad, weeping, half-open crown, capricious growing
Bark and branches	twigs light brown, bark grey-brown, smooth
Leaf	broad oval, green, 6 - 12 cm, autumn colour yellow
Autumn colour	yellow
Flowers	white, about 2.5 cm, buds light pink, April, fragrant flowers
Fruits	none, fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	any: not in wet soils
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C)
Wind resistance	fairly
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant)
Application	parks, tree containers, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Prunus x yedoensis 'Ivensii' is a decorative weeping form that is usually grafted on a stem. Height 3 - 4 m. The main branches grow out horizontally and the thin lateral branches hang vertically down. The wide oval leaves are 6 - 12 cm long. Emerging leaves are very light green. The autumn colour is yellow. Abundant flowers in late March and early April. The flowers are pale pink in the bud and emerge practically white. They have a slight almond scent. Flower diameter approx. 2.5 cm. No fruits. Winter hardiness zone: 6a
