



Prunus 'Okame'



Height	3-5 (6) m
Crown	oval, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	brown, grey
Leaf	green, bronze
Autumn colour	orange, red
Flowers	reddish pink, flowers in March
Fruits	fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardness zone	6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C)
Wind resistance	moderate
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant)
Application	parks, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, feathered tree, multi-stem tree

A bushy shrub that remains small and is sometimes cultivated on a stem. It then forms a narrow oval crown. Height 3 - 5 (6) m. The small narrow leaves have a sharply serrated edge and grow to 7 - 8 cm in size. They emerge with a bronze colour that later turns green. They become orange with red tints in the autumn. The tree produces many carmine-pink flowers from late March to mid-April. The flowers are in twos and threes and are single. They are approximately 2 - 2.5 cm in diameter. An ornamental Prunus for private and public gardens. This is a tree for a sunny sheltered site. Winter hardness zone: 6a
