



## Prunus 'Pandora'



<b>Height</b>	4-6 m
<b>Crown</b>	columnar, half-open crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green, bronze
<b>Autumn colour</b>	orange, red
<b>Flowers</b>	white, light pink, flowers in April
<b>Fruits</b>	red, little
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates partial paving
<b>Winter hardness zone</b>	6a (-23,3 to -20,6 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	moderate
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant)
<b>Application</b>	parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens
<b>Shape</b>	clearstem tree, multi-stem tree

Prunus 'Pandora' starts off with a columnar crown that later becomes more vase-shaped. Height 4 - 6 m. The ovoid to elongated leaves emerge bronze-coloured and later turn dark green. The leaves attain a size of 5 - 7 cm. The autumn colour is orange-red. The numerous single flowers, Ø approx. 3 cm, are white with some pink. The tree flowers in early April, before the emergence of the leaves. The red fruits resembling cherries occur only infrequently. Suitable for planting in gardens and streets. Prefers nutritious, fairly humid and loamy soil. Winter hardness zone: 6
