Prunus ×subhirtella 'Pendula Rubra'



| Height | 2-4 m, slow growing |
|-----------------------|--|
| Crown | broad weeping, half-open crown |
| Bark and branches | brown, grey, black |
| Leaf | green |
| Autumn colour | yellow, orange |
| Flowers | dark pink, flowers in April |
| Fruits | black |
| Spines/thorns | None |
| Toxicity | usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock |
| Soil type | clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil |
| Paving | tolerates no paving |
| Winter hardiness zone | 5b (-26,0 to -23,4 °C) |
| Wind resistance | moderate |
| Other resistances | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6) |
| Fauna tree | resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for bees (honey plant) |
| Application | parks, cemeteries, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens |
| Shape | clearstem tree |

Prunus subhirtella 'Pendula Rubra' Usually grafted on a stem. The main branches spread horizontally while the relatively young twigs are very pendulous. It forms a decorative winter silhouette. It eventually attains a height of approx. 4 m. The green leaves are somewhat longer and narrower than those of the species, their autumnal colour yellow-orange. Produces many flowers from the end of March to early April. The flower buds are dark pink, the flowers bright pink and single. Flower diameter approx. 2 cm. It does not stand up to wet soil. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
