



Robinia pseudoacacia

'Umbraculifera'



Height	5 - 6 m
Crown	round, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	twigs olive green to brown, thornless, bark grey-brown, deeply grooved
Leaf	odd-pinnate, 15 - 25 cm, 9 - 19 leaf segments, 1 - 4 cm, green, feathered leaf
Flowers	none
Fruits	none, fruitless cultivar
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	few requirements as long as well drained
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil
Paving	tolerates paving
Winter hardiness zone	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
Wind resistance	moderate
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), resistant to de-icing salt
Application	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, parks, squares, cemeteries, industrial areas, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, feathered tree
Origin	Austria, 1813

Small tree with a spherical crown up to 5 -6 m in height and width. Annual pruning keeps the crown compact. If it is not clipped, the tree develops an umbellate crown. Then it can sometimes attain a height of up to 8 m and develop a characteristic manner of growth.

'Umbraculifera' is always grafted on a stem, at heights between 1.80 m and 2.50 m. The branches do not have any thorns. The green leaves are smaller than those of the species, as are the leaf segments. Leaves out late and keeps its leaves long into the autumn. Does not produce flowers and grows well in light, calcareous soil. Winter hardiness zone: 5a
