## Salix alba 'Liempde'



20-25 m, fast growing
narrow conical, half-open crown
grey, yellowbrown
green, greygreen
yellow, flowers in April
fruitless cultivar
None
usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, all soil types
suitable for wet soil, withstand short flood, withstand long flood
tolerates paving
4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
good
resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, valuable for butterflies
avenues and broad streets, parks, cemeteries, large gardens, windbreaks
clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Salix alba 'Liempde' is a male cultivar with a vertical stem and straight, vertical side branches, creating a fairly narrow, pyramidal crown. Height 20 - 25 m, significantly shorter when used as pollard willow. The trunk has deep, corky grooves and the twigs are very bendable. The lanceolate leaves are dark green, have silvery hair and are somewhat larger than those of the species. The yellow catkins appear at the same time as the leaves. 'Liempde' is one of the most commonly planted white willows in the Netherlands. Reasonably resistant to watermark disease. Winterhardiness zone: 4
