



## Sorbus aria 'Lutescens'



Height	8-12 m
Crown	broad conical, dark, dense crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green, greygreen, white
Flowers	white, flowers in May
Fruits	orange, red
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, calcareous soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	5a (-28,8 to -26,1 °C)
Wind resistance	fairly to good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
Application	avenues and broad streets, parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, large gardens
Shape	clearstem tree

A tree with a dense spherical crown that later becomes broad ovoid. Reaches a height of between 8 and 12 m. This cultivar has remarkable leaves that are silver-white on both sides, usually somewhat yellower on the upper side. This means that the leaves are a light grey colour in the spring and early summer. Later in the season the upper side of the leaves turns green and thus becomes identical to those of the species. 'Lutescens' sheds its leaves early in the autumn. In contrast to other cultivars of *S. aria*, 'Lutescens' does not stand up to hard surfaces. Winter hardiness zone: 5a
