Sorbus aucuparia var. edulis



Height	8-12 m
Crown	oval, half-open crown
Bark and branches	grey
Leaf	green, feathered leaf
Autumn colour	yellow, orange, red
Flowers	white, flowers in May
Fruits	edible fruits, red
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, nutrient-poor soil, acid soil
Soil moisture	suitable for dry soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
Wind resistance	good
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, provides food for birds
Application	avenues and broad streets, narrow streets, parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, roof gardens, large gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem

Sorbus aucuparia 'Edulis' (syn. Sorbus a. var. moravica) has a loose, narrow pyramidal to oval crown that is more regular than that of the species. Height 8 - 12 m. The twigs are thicker than those of the species and the leaves are larger and darker. Another difference is that the fruits are more abundant and larger, diameter approx. 1.3 cm. They are edible, sweet sour and rich in vitamins. The fruits appear in August and September. Winter hardiness zone: 4
