



## Tilia cordata 'Lico'



<b>Height</b>	4-6 m
<b>Crown</b>	round/spherical, dark, dense crown
<b>Bark and branches</b>	brown, grey
<b>Leaf</b>	green
<b>Flowers</b>	cream white, flowers in June, fragrant flowers
<b>Fruits</b>	grey
<b>Spines/thorns</b>	None
<b>Toxicity</b>	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
<b>Soil type</b>	clayed soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil, all soil types
<b>Soil moisture</b>	suitable for dry soil
<b>Paving</b>	tolerates paving
<b>Winter hardiness zone</b>	4 (-34,4 to -28,9 °C)
<b>Wind resistance</b>	good
<b>Other resistances</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind
<b>Fauna tree</b>	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), can withstand wind, valuable for butterflies
<b>Application</b>	parks, squares, tree containers, cemeteries, coastal areas, large gardens, small gardens, patio gardens

Very compact, slow-growing Dutch cultivar of *T. cordata* that, when grafted on a stem, grows to become a small, spherical tree with a crown diameter of max. 3 m. The greenish yellow colour of the young twigs is remarkable. This adds decorative value particularly in the winter. The bright green leaves have a heart-shaped base and taper to a point at the top. They remain much smaller than those of the species, approx. 3 - 6 cm, but are larger than those of the cultivar 'Monto'. Due to its modest size, 'Lico' is suitable for small front gardens, patio gardens, roof decks and plant containers. Winter hardiness zone: 4
