

Acer opalus



Height	10 - 15 m
Crown	ovoid / egg-shaped
Bark and branches	branches brown brown, bark brown, later flaking off in plates
Leaf	palmately lobed, 3-5 (7) lobes, 16-20 cm, mat green
Autumn colour	yellow, orange, red
Flowers	greenish yellow, with hairy pedicels, end of March
Fruits	single-seed, winged nutlets, always paired
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	preferably on calcareous, not in wet soils, well-drained
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	6 (-23,3 to -17,8 °C)
Wind resistance	fairly
Other resistances	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6)
Fauna tree	resistant to frost (WH 1 - 6), valuable for butterflies
Application	parks, cemeteries, large gardens
Shape	clearstem tree, multi-stem treem
Origin	Central and Southern Europe and Northwest Africa (Algeria and Morocco)
