



Luma apiculata



Height	5-6 m (15 m)
Crown	irregular sphere
Bark and branches	twigs grey-green, bark bright cinnamon brown, light brown-grey flaking
Leaf	evergreen, elliptical, 1-2,5 cm, glossy dark green
Flowers	white, solitary, 2 cm tall, July-October
Fruits	berry-shaped, 0,8-1cm, shiny black purple, edible
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	any, if well-drained
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	8b (-9,4,5 to -6,7 °C)
Wind resistance	moderate
Fauna tree	valuable for bees (honey plant)
Application	tree containers, patio gardens

Synonyms	Myrtus luma, Myrtus apiculata
