Sequoia sempervirens 'Illa Martin'



Height	30 - 40 m
Crown	narrow pyramidal
Bark and branches	twigs reddish brown, bark orange brown, thick and softly fibrous, flaking in long strips
Leaf	needles, arranged in spiral shape, dark green, 1.5 - 2,5 cm, blue green
Flowers	inconspicuous
Fruits	hanging, ovoid cones, about 1,5 - 3 cm
Spines/thorns	None
Toxicity	usually not toxic to people, (large) pets and livestock
Soil type	sandy, loamy soil, well-permeable
Soil moisture	suitable for wet soil
Paving	tolerates no paving
Winter hardiness zone	7b (-14,9 to -12,3 °C)
Wind resistance	good, also tolerates sea wind
Other resistances	can withstand wind
Application	parks, cemeteries, coastal areas, large gardens, windbreaks
Shape	clearstem tree
